While many of us are still reeling from what happened at Swan Boat Club, I know that we all must persevere. I send my good friend, Diane, a prayer about once an hour, and all the rest of those affected about once a day.

A couple of things on my mind, "boats and sailboats". I know powerboats don't like to give sailboats right of way or come down off of plane, so let's look at how we can all get along.

Sailboats only have "right of way" when they are under sail. If they do not have a sail up, they are not entitled to any more rights than a powerboat.

Why do sailboats have right of way?


Sailboats are not able to head directly into the wind, they must be about 45 degrees off the wind in either direction. They also draw more water than a power boat, so depth of water is a major issue for them. If you are unsure what they are doing, steer clear. If you are going to throw them a wake, try to put it behind them rather than in front of them.

Why are there so many sailboats in one place?

They are probably racing. (and yes, some take it way too serious) You should also be aware that there have been some new courses set up this year that will sometimes see them in the channel directly across from Holiday Harbor. Depending on wind direction, they might be flying a spinnaker on this leg of the race. (Spinnaker: a large colorful half-balloon-shaped sail used on downwind legs) This activity is very technical and some crews have more experience than others. Stay clear, especially in windy conditions. Funky things often happen.

There is no reason why there is any kind of divide between power boaters and sail boaters. We all just need to have some respect for each other so we can all enjoy our boats and activities. By the way, I wave to both kinds of boats and I own both kinds of boats. If you see "Hat Trick" out there, you better wave back. Sail boaters, if you see "Still Rockin" wave at you, wave back. It's just common courtesy and respect.

PS, I race every Monday and Wednesday night. We often need crew, if you ever want to give sailing a try, give me a shout. (no I'm not trying to take you away from powerboating) \Box


